Shelley Livery Button.

The Warnham Society recently received the following message and image, related to the Shelley family.

Message from Simon Hedger

Hi. I recently found a livery button in a field of a farm just outside Horsham and having done some research it's a button of the Shelley baronets and dates from 1800-1824, so most likely from Sir Timothy Shelley as the button has marital Arms on it, with the husband's being on the left half of the shield, and the Arms of his wife's father on the other half.

It seems to be a PILFOLD family Arms on the right, so the button is as I mentioned above probably from the household of the 2nd Baronet, Sir Timothy SHELLEY (1753-1844), and his wife Elizabeth (1753-1844), the daughter of Charles PILFORD.

I would be happy to send you a photo of the button if it's of any interest to the Society especially as I found a using piece written about the Shelley family on the website.

The griffins head with coronet at the top of the button isn't clear from my photo but it's the same as per the other image attached.
