Including:         <ul> <li>The new Parish Clerk is Ashley Brooks</li> <li>A Youth Liaison officer is working with youth groups in the local area</li> <li>A watch is kept on the incineration facilities in Warnham so that the Council is up-to-date with any possible expansion plans</li> <li>Traffic-calming measures in Bell Rd and School Hill are under consideration</li> <li>A 'no left turn' from the A281 into Strood Lane has been approved</li> <li>Lay-bys in a few Warnham roads, with the aim of increasing the amount of parking for residents, is a possibility</li> <li>Trees have been planted in a few locations in the village.
